After a quarter century of steady, thoughtful work, KLT has 835 household members, a team of nineteen highly regarded Directors, an Advisory Board of community and regional leaders, an annual field trip and Lyceum series, important partnerships with other organizations and agencies, and three year-round staff. To date, with your support, KLT volunteers and staff have constructed over thirty-seven miles of trails on over 4,670 acres of permanently conserved land and protected fifteen miles of shoreline. ccording to NerdWallet, a consumer advocacy website, conducted a study on the best towns in Maine for young families, and Winthrop is in the top ten!

To find the best places for future parents and young families to settle down, NerdWallet analyzed data from

59 towns in the Pine Tree State according to five criteria:

- 1. Public school ratings
- 2. Median home value
- 3. Cost of homeownership
- 4. Median income
- 5. Economic growth

NerdWallet ranked Winthrop third after assessing the town's cost of living, education system, and economic growth. The town's school district received an eight-out-of-ten rating from the nonprofit, GreatSchools. Winthrop also has the second-lowest monthly homeowner costs of all towns in the top ten at \$1,202.
